There will be a significant focus on using sensory imagery and figurative devices to effectively convey ideas, characters and settings. This is a time for students to experiment and take risks in their imaginative writing by constructing similes, metaphors, personification and hyperbole and avoiding clichéd expressions. Skills to effectively plan for writing will be taught as well as how to use dialogue in an appealing and valuable way.

All students are encouraged to join and participate in the school's online writing group run through Google Classroom. A plethora of activities is on offer and there is something to suit all skill levels and needs. Years 7 to 10 will be writing a narrative in English this term so now is the time to focus on developing the skills needed to write well imaginatively.

LEARNING OUR NUMBER FACTS

During class lessons, students are encouraged to practise their number facts and write correct solutions for problems into their work books. Learning our number facts is important because they form the building blocks for higher-level mathematic concepts. For example, adding and subtracting larger numbers, telling time, counting money, measurement, and long multiplication and division are all concepts that are significantly easier for a child to learn once they have mastered their number facts. Regular revision of class work and examples will also improve the student's confidence and ability with Mathematics.

Young Mathematicians Program

The University of Newcastle Young Mathematicians Program (UoNYMP) will be running a series of mathematics enrichment workshops Term 3 of the school year.

Please note that there is **NO COST** to participants in the program. In each workshop, a mathematician from the University will introduce the students to a mathematical topic that they find interesting and then guide the students through further explorations. Note that participants are welcome to attend one, some, or all of the activities across the term, they do not have to commit to the whole term. 


Year 7 2020 Transition Event – Mini Lessons


