#### FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Welcome back to term 4. The last term, in what has been, a challenging year that has created a new normal in our world. The new normal for our school is continuing to evolve as the restrictions are slowly eased.

This term we are able to have excursions, some Year 6 Transition events and our Year 12 Graduation and Formal with specific guidelines being adhered to. Parents and carers are allowed onsite for welfare meetings and to volunteer in the canteen. We are certainly missing the connection with our families and community and hope that 2021 brings further scaling back of restrictions to allow us to re-engage with you all.

On a more positive note, Year 12 have started the HSC exams. Their last week of school was filled with fun as they dressed up in their chosen theme costumes and played a few harmless pranks. They have been an absolute delight as a cohort and certainly reflect our school core values. The Beresfield Bowling Club is again hosting our students for their exams. We thank the club and appreciate their continued support of our school. The new Year 12 cohort have started the HSC course which we hope will continue without any disruption.

The number of transition events have been limited and to compensate for this, the families of Year 6 students will receive a comprehensive information package and are encouraged to contact the school for further queries. We have recently been notified that the Maitland Regional Art Gallery has won a MAGNA award. The Australian Museums and Galleries Association Incorporated (AMaGA) is the national association and peak advocacy body representing museums and galleries. The entry, *Stories from Wonnarua Country* won its category Interpretation, Learning & Audience Engagement. Over the holidays our new outdoor gym was completed. This resource will be used as part of the PD/H/PE curriculum. Students will be able to access the gym during breaktimes by using a pass that will be managed by the PD/H/PE faculty. The indoor gym will also have additional equipment this term. The value of regular physical activity is an essential part of the holistic development of young people and we are resourcing the school to support this.

The school recognises that the implementation of BYOD at our school inherently imposes a financial cost on students and their families for the purchase of a device. This cost occurs in all BYOD schools. Where possible, we will provide short term loan devices to students while their families make arrangement for the purchase/lease of their own device.

#### Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL)

This year so far has been a successful one for students with PBL awards. There are 5 levels of achievement that students work towards over the year where they receive positive points for excellence in the classroom, meeting expectations and core values and demonstrating positive behaviour in all school settings. Beresfield Bowling Club are sponsors for our PBL program which allows us to provide awards in the form of Gift Vouchers to students as they achieve the various levels. To date, the stats for students currently at each level are:

Bronze Award (50+ points) - 354 students

Silver Award (100+ points) - 222 students receiving \$20 vouchers

Gold Award (200+ points) - 50 students receiving \$20 vouchers

Platinum Award (300+ points) - 4 students receiving \$30 vouchers

This equates to \$5560 in rewards that students have earned and 630 PBL pens handed out. An excellent achievement from our students.

#### Year 12

The HSC is going well and students have been positive so far about the experience. At school we continue to provide release for staff to conduct final revision sessions for the remaining exams. All students are expected to attend these sessions. The final examination is November 11, 2020. The Year 12 Graduation Assembly will be held on November 12, 2020 in the school MPC. Due to ongoing COVID-19 restrictions parents and families will not be able to attend. There will be a professional videographer filming the occasion and the footage will be made available to all students. We also hope to livestream the event on the day further information will be provided if this is to occur.

The formal will be held at Easts Bowling Club on the November 16, 2020. Again, we are governed by both venue and Department of Education restrictions. Some staff will be in attendance with the 46 students. We would ask that photos be taken prior to arriving at the venue as meeting in the park by the club is not permitted. Photos will be taken during the evening for students also.

#### Years 8, 9, 11

Year 8, 9 and 11 have selected their courses and electives for 2021. Any variations of these need to be requested through the Deputy Principals. If you need to contact a Deputy Principal regarding your child please feel free to call and request a phone meeting. Attendance on site for meetings is still restricted.

Year 11 will be able to consider if they are able to remove a course from their program of study in the HSC course. Mr Brownsmith will meet with each student to discuss this and students have been made aware that all outstanding course N-awards must be completed to a satisfactory standard.

Year 9 are engaging in a Careers Quest. This gives them the opportunity to talk to representatives from: TAFE, University of Newcastle, Real Estate, Plumbing, Defence forces and many more, to get valuable information that may help them in their future planning.

#### ENGLISH

#### Wellbeing Wall – Energy Drinks

One major health concern surrounding energy drinks is their high caffeine and sugar content. Caffeine is an addictive substance that can affect the heart and nervous system. While it may temporarily help you overcome symptoms such as tiredness and restore alertness, it can have other negative side effects, especially in children and adolescents. Some of these are:

- Difficulty concentrating
- Difficulty sleeping/ insomnia
- Nervousness
- Anxiety
- Headache
- Rapid heart rate

Energy drinks may also contain other additives such as B Vitamins, guarana, taurine, ephedrine and ginseng which act as stimulants. They are low in nutrition value and high in kilojoules, increasing the risk of excessive weight gain, increasing heart rate and increasing anxiety. #### 2021 Vaccination Program

Year 7 students will be offered the following vaccinations in 2021. Forms will be distributed early in 2021.

Human Papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine (2 doses at least 6 months apart) and Diphtheria-Tetanus-Pertussis (whooping cough) (dTpa) vaccine (1 dose)

#### What's happening in Careers and Transition?

It has been another busy month for the Career and Transition Team (CATT). We have been liaising with numerous businesses to create school industry partnerships which aim to help our students understand and develop the skills needed in the workforce so that they can be better prepared for the future of work. When students have sustained a quality exposure to the world of work they are more likely to be engaged in school, be motivated and have a higher willingness to learn. Students also experience improvements in attainment, school attendance and enrolment in tertiary education. During Term 4, the CATT will be engaging Year 10 students in an asset-based design thinking career and transition program during their LAW Lessons. Lessons started in Week 1 and they are being well received by students.

#### White Card Training

Our second White Card Training Course will be offered to students on Thursday November 26 2020. The course is run by an accredited trainer and students will receive a Statement of Attainment and a Safework NSW Statement of Training. The cost of the course is \$99. Notes can be collected from the CAT Team in the Learning Centre (Library). Course numbers are limited.

#### Youth Engagement Strategy Program (YES Program)

We have 10 students attending the Maitland TAFE every Tuesday from Week 3 – Week 6 for Introduction to Early Childhood Education and Care Course.
